## **22nd IFIP World Computer Congress**

Amsterdam, the Netherlands - 24 - 26 September 2012

### The IFIP World Computer Congress 2012 (IFIP WCC 2012)

The General Assembly of IFIP accepted a proposal from the NGI, the Dutch Member of IFIP, to organize the IFIP WCC 2012 in Amsterdam from 24 to 26 September 2012.

#### Title / theme of the IFIP WCC 2012

The theme of WCC 2012, drafted by an initial work committee is as follows:

Putting the IT professional first: Towards a secure, reliable and innovative information society

The 3 pillars of the IFIP WCC 2012 are therefore:

Innovation
Professionalism
Security/Reliability

Information technologies play a key role in the global society of the 21st century. Software is becoming more and more the engine of our economies, facilitates *innovation* in many industries and government organizations, and among others, supports democracy and personal development. Access to IT may become even a new human right.

Ultimately, IT professionals — in their diversity and regardless of their geographical dispersion — must together ensure that software and systems created are **secure and reliable** and in order to be able to do this they not only need the technical knowledge but also the appropriate skills and **professionalism**.

The main purpose of the IFIP WCC 2012 is to create a platform where these 3 pillars and their interrelationship with each other can be debated to the benefit of the IT industry and the world in general.

The diagram next page emphasizes

the essential relation between the 3 pillars and

the fact that WCC 2012 will not be an event on Security/Reliability or Innovation or Professionalism, but on the dependence of these 3 pillars on each other and the way each one influences the other.

#### The Vision of the IFIP WCC 2012

After 60 years of development and deployment of IT, we need a more coherent, structured and harmonized approach to digital technology in a connected, truly global world. Without saying is that such an integrated approach does include the people 'behind' the information society: academics and professionals in the public and private sectors.

For the first time in the history, the 2012 IFIP World Computer Congress will draft both the short and long-term agendas for IT academics and professionals, who must excel, not only in creating innovative solutions but also in making the information technology and our world-wide society more secure.

It is envisioned that the IFIP WCC 2012 will be a ground breaking 'must attend' event which will be the first of such visionary conferences organized by IFIP.

#### The Structure of the IFIP WCC 2012

The event will be 2,5 or 3 days; the number of parallel sessions will be limited . WCC 2012 will **not** have the typical peer reviewed scientific contributions. Instead the contributions will be invited.

## Progress so far

- An Executive Committee is operational since the approval of GA and is meeting very frequently to start all the detailed lines of work and to monitor progress.
- A **Recommendations Committee** is being established to underline on a very high level to all the stakeholders the importance of the topics and the role of WCC 2012 in addressing them.
- The Local Organizing Committee (LOC), under the Chair of Mr Fons de Breet had been established, and has already progressed well on a large number of matters.
- The International Program Committee (IPC), under the Chair of Basie von Solms, had been established and already has nearly 20 members. The IPC has also progressed well in terms of content and structure of WCC 2012.

We are specifically identifying high level speakers who have a vision of the future development of ICT in the next decade, and who can share such futuristic vision with the delegates.

### Invitation to participate in a joint EU MATURE - IFIP AGORA workshop

MATURE is a large-scale integrating project (IP), co-funded by the European Commission, Unit for Technology-Enhanced Learning (TEL) within Call 1 of the Seventh Framework Programme (FP7). It runs from April 2008 to March 2012 (see: http://mature-ip.eu). Since the agility of organizations has become the critical success factor for competitiveness in a world characterized by an accelerating rate of change, MA-TURE provides R&D activities in the area of 'Continuous Social Learning in Knowledge Networks'. Agility requires that e.g. companies and their employees together and mutually dependently learn and develop their competencies efficiently in order to improve productivity of knowledge work within the organization and in cross-organizational 'Communities of Practice'. Failures of organisation-driven approaches to technology-enhanced learning and the success of community-driven approaches in the spirit of Web 2.0 have shown that for that agility we need to leverage the intrinsic motivation of employees to engage in collaborative learning activities, and combine it with a new form of organisational guidance. For that purpose, MATURE conceives individual learning processes to be interlinked (the output of a learning process is input to others) in a knowledge-maturing process in which knowledge changes in nature. This knowledge can take the form of classical content in varying degrees of maturity, but also involves tasks & processes, semantic structures and social interaction. The goal of MATURE is to understand this maturing process better, based on empirical studies, and to build tools and services to reduce maturing barriers.

MATURE brings together an experienced multi-disciplinary team of outstanding experts. To leverage their combined skills, it utilizes a participatory design methodology, involving companies inside and outside the consortium. An associate partner network was established to maximize the project's impact.

AGORA is an IFIP initiative launched by T-3 that aimed to implement a dynamic methodology for initiating cooperative projects with a first pilot project on individual competence development in conjunction with Lifelong Learning. TC-3 decided at an AGORA workshop in Poitiers (December 2010) that the focus of new AGORA projects will be on the relationship between competence development of members of staff and Organisational Knowledge Management and Organisational Evolution. Since the beginning of the AGORA initiative several projects have been launched by TC-3 with international stakeholders (e.g. UNESCO, UNITAR, the Digital Solidarity Fund). However, for increasing the advancement of IFIP's strategy it could be helpful if other Technical committees would be stronger involved in a process of evolutionary change inside IFIP in order to improve the cooperation between the TCs and to generate synergy of action especially with regard to transversal themes of the information and knowledge society, that are not just technology based. Examples are besides Lifelong Learning e.g. the themes of Security and Trust, E-Governance and Ethics that have been discussed at the Summits on the Information Society during the last years.

According to these requirements and in order to align the IFIP AGORA Initiative with them, the participants of the Workshop in Poitiers discussed and decided on an agenda of further action. Among others activities the participants agreed to organize a joined workshop together with the EU-IP project MATURE, that fits very well with the AGORA objectives. Furthermore the IFIP AGORA Initiative plays an active role in MATURE as an associated partner.

The **Joint AGORA – MATURE Workshop** takes place on 13 – 14 October 2011 in Barcelona, Spain and will be linked to an Associated Partner Meeting with representatives of business and industry from the AP-Network (see: http://mature-ip.eu/associate-partners). During the workshop members of the MATURE

consortium will present the results of their research on knowledge maturing and related IT-Software-Tools, developed so far. In detail

Based on the results of three years of empirical research efforts (ethnographic study, representative study, in depth study) with hundreds of European and globally acting companies from different economic sectors, an analysis of real-world maturing practices, and derived knowledge maturing services will be presented.

The results are consolidated in a sound general conceptual model of knowledge maturing (the so-called knowledge maturing model landscape), which consists of the identification of phases of knowledge maturing and its characteristics, indicators for observing knowledge maturing, identification of key knowledge maturing and guidance activities to be supported by tools, and motivational and social barriers and ways to overcome them.

A widget-based, Web 2.0 inspired Learning & Maturing Environment, integrating personal and organizational perspectives, embedded into the working environment of application partners will be presented

Reusable Knowledge Maturing Services that are based on knowledge maturing indicators, which can be integrated into other contexts will be presented and discussed.

Members of the IFIP AGORA will present academic and/or professional fields where transversal initiatives will be fruitful creating new possibilities of developments in knowledge maturing processes. It is also vital to give priority to practical activities that enhances efficient ways of working within the framework of IFIP – making it more relevant, vital and productive for members and member organizations. There is a need to recruit young academics and professionals that can make a difference for the future of IFIP, being familiar with web 2.0 and ready for web 3.0 ways of organising and working.

In plenary and break-out sessions the participants of the Workshop will discuss the possible impact of the conceptual findings and the technical developments of the MATURE project on AGORA's future work and the organizational cooperation within IFIP.

The participation in the workshop is without fee for IFIP TC representatives and representatives of members of the Associated Partner Network. Furthermore, MATURE can contribute to the travel expenses of a limited number of participants.

### **IP3 Board Elects New Chair**

The Board of Directors of the *International Professional Practice Partnership* (IP3) have elected as its new Chairman, Dr. Roger Johnson, with immediate effect.

Dr. Johnson has a longstanding and distinguished career in ICT and most recently retired as Dean of the Faculty at the Department of Computer Science and Information Systems at Birkbeck College, University of London. In March 2010 he was made a Fellow of Birkbeck College. Dr. Johnson was Honorary Secretary of IFIP (International Federation for Information Processing) for 11 years to September 2010 and continues to represent IFIP on the IP3 Board. He is also a Past President of BCS (British Computer Society), and CEPIS (Council of European Informatics Societies). He was a leading participant in creating of ECDL (European Computer Driving Licence), "inventor" of EUCIP (European Certification of Informatics Professionals), BCS representative to Engineering Council UK, co-organiser of an international conference on Global IT Skills, and participated in CEN/ISSS workshops on professional skills.

"It is an honour to be asked to guide the IP3 at this exciting period in its history," explains Mr. Johnson. "IP3 is an important global initiative and I look forward to continue supporting its efforts in implementing its vision to promote professionalism in IT, define international professional standards and create a global infrastructure that will encourage and support the development of both ICT practitioners and employer organizations."

Dr. Johnson will succeed Mr. Greg Lane, who has served as Chairman of the Board since September 2008. Among Mr. Lane's main achievements are the enhancements of the global dialogue around professionalism in IT. Under his stewardship, IP3 established the IP3 *Global Industry Council* (IP3-GIC), adopted a long-term strategic plan, and ratified a policy concerning mutual acceptance of professional certification.

Mr. Lane will remain a member of the IP3 Board in his capacity as representative for the Canadian Information Processing Society (CIPS).

At their meeting on 11 May 2011 members of the Board of Directors expressed their sincere gratitude to Mr. Lane for the outstanding services he has rendered to IP3 over the past three years.

## Open and Social Technologies for Networked Learning

In 2011, Tallinn (Estonia) is the European Cultural Capital. In 2012, Tallinn will host an IFIP open working conference on "Open and Social Technologies for Networked Learning". Sponsored by IFIP Working Group 3.4 (Professional Education), the conference is jointly organized by Tallinn University and University of Tampere (Finland). It will take place from 30<sup>th</sup> of July to 3<sup>rd</sup> of August 2012.

Open and Social Technologies play an increasingly important role in many educational settings. Social technologies are naturally entering primary, secondary and higher education where they blur the boundaries between formal and informal learning. Social technologies also enter the workplaces where they connect learners and bridge the boundaries between individual learning and organizational knowledge processes. Not only do these technologies connect learners independent of place and time, they have also been found to exert emergent properties. For example, wikis or social tagging environments are increasingly used for collaborative knowledge construction where new knowledge emerges from a large scale interaction of individuals. These properties and their impact on individual, group and organizational learning have only started to be researched.

Open Source Software (OSS) and Technologies have received extensive research attention due to some favorable properties contrasting with a traditional understanding of software development and the use of those systems. Many OSS issues are motivations for OSS developers and licensing bodies. However, important research areas in OSS are product and implementation success and the use of OSS in different educational and enterprise settings. OSS can also serve as a platform for providing services to user communities. Especially in developing countries, OSS provides an attractive opportunity.

# IFIP International Working Conference on Enterprise Interoperability (IWEI 2011)

The IFIP International Working Conference on Enterprise Interoperability (IWEI 2011) was held on March 23-24 at the Royal Institute of Technology (KTH) in Stockholm, Sweden. KTH also hosted 4 workshops on March 22, devoted to discussing and exploring new issues in topics that were complementary to the ones covered by the working conference. Over 50 researchers and practitioners

from almost 20 countries participated in the event.

The single-track program of the working conference comprised 15 full and 5 short papers on topics such as model transformation, enterprise architecture, ontologies, modeling languages, business processes, requirements, service monitoring, and trust models, all in the context of Enterprise Interoperability. These papers were selected from a total of 47 submissions, resulting in an acceptance percentage of 30%. All papers are published in the Springer Lecture Notes in Business Information Processing. Additionally, selected papers will be invited to a special issue in the academic journal Computers in Industry, published by Elsevier.

The conference featured excellent keynotes by Dr. Gérald Santucci and Dr. Andreas Friesen. Gérald Santucci, Head of Unit "Internet of Things and Enterprise Environment", DG "Information Society and Media", of the European Commission presented the research roadmap developed by the community of scientists, developers and other stakeholders in the context of the "Future Internet Enterprise Systems" cluster. Andreas Friesen, Research Program Manager Service Science of SAP, elaborated on the challenges in enterprise systems management and engineering for the networked enterprise of the future.

At the end of the conference, the IFIP TC5 Best Paper Award and Best Student Paper Award were bestowed on Dick Quartel from the Novay research institute (The Netherlands) and Sihem Mallek from the Ecole des Mines d'Alès (France), respectively.

The IWEI series of events began in 2008 as a satellite workshop of the EDOC Conference in Munich (Germany) with a modest 15 participants, then in 2009 was organized as a self-standing workshop in Valencia (Spain) with 30 participants. As mentioned, the Stockholm event attracted 50 participants, thus maintaining a sizeable growth rate.
